## Morris, a genius of the Ninth Art!

Morris, a genius of the Ninth Art!

The father of Lucky Luke was born in 1923 in Kortijk, Belgium. After starting out in cartoon studios, he created Lucky Luke, his word, and the main characters of the series, whose first adventures would appear in 1947 in L'Almanach de Sprinu. For several years afterwards, Morris pitels his trade in the United States with his Friends Ander Franquia and Oseph Gillain and the stars of satirical Mad magazine, Kurtzman, Davis, and Wood; meanwhile, Lucky Lude found is place in the world of comies thanks to its simple design, its expressivenees, and the instincts of its creator. In fact, Morris's way with words brought forth the now-famous phrases "The man who shoots faster than his one shadow" and "the entit and".

Ten volumes later, he met René Goscinny, who would become Lucky Luke's writer for almost 40 volumes. Several others followed in Goscinny's footsteps. Today, the saga of the Lonesome Cowboy created by Morris encompasses close to 90 volumes. Early on, Morris displayed a passion for film and animation, and he closely monitored the many adaptations of his work.

It was during production of the final 52 episodes of the series, titled *The New Adventures of Lucky, Luke*, that Morris passed away, on 16 July 2001. He remains one of the superstars of comic book creators. His characters and the world be created have become timeless.
